PROGRAM OBJECTIVES:

- To educate Grade 1 to 10 public school students on nutrition, health and wellness through the Nestlé Wellness Campus Program with the use of the Nestlé modules based on the Most Essential Learning Competencies;
- To develop healthier eating, drinking and lifestyle habits through the promotion of seven
 (7) healthy habits, namely:
 - 1. Choose Nutritious and Varied Options
 - 2. Manage Portions
 - 3. Choose to Drink Water and Milk
 - 4. Enjoy Meals Together
 - 5. Play Actively
 - 6. Care for the Planet
 - 7. Keep Good Hygiene
- To support public school teachers through the Nestlé Wellness Campus Facebook group, which serves as a platform where they can share, learn and apply the best practices to effectively promote the seven healthy habits among learners and parents.

SCOPE:

Grades 1-10 students in all public schools of participating DepEd regions Public school teachers (MAPEH) of participating DepEd regions

MECHANICS:

The Program is a partnership between the Department of Education and Nestlé Philippines, Inc. (NPI) and will be implemented by Alphabet Soup, Inc. (ASI), in close coordination with the DepEd Regional and Schools Division Offices. Division Supervisors or those duly appointed by the Division Superintendents will serve as the main contact persons to ensure that the program will be implemented in all schools in both grade school and high school levels.

The 2020-2021 Nestlé Wellness Campus Program implementation has its emphasis on developing healthy habits of students through nutrition education, physical activity, good personal hygiene and solid waste management. An exclusive Nestlé Wellness Campus Facebook group for teachers will also be utilized for the inter-school contest and to serve as a platform for sharing their wellness ideas and practices. Wellness-related events such as webinars, cooking demos and Nestlé-sponsored promos, will also be conducted in this Facebook group.

NPI, through ASI, will provide copies of the mechanics to all DepEd regional offices and division offices. Online launchings will be conducted by NPI through ASI. Division and district cascades will also be conducted online to ensure that the program mechanics will be disseminated to all school principals and MAPEH school coordinators.

The implementation of the program will be in three parts as follows:

Part 1: NUTRITION, PHYSICAL ACTIVITY, HYGIENE AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT EDUCATION FOR ELEMENTARY AND HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

- NPI, through ASI, will provide nutrition, PE, immunity, hygiene and solid waste management modules. These modules are encouraged to be integrated in the grade school and junior high school MAPEH curriculum, subject to DepEd rules and regulations.
- 2. These modules are aligned with DepEd's MELCs and have been designed primarily for adult-assisted learning at home (Grades 1 to 3) or self-directed learning by the student (Grades 4 to 10).
- 3. Worksheets and activities are also given which the students and/or parents can read and work together at home.
- 4. To ensure smooth program implementation, NPI, through ASI, will provide soft copies of the following materials to both division supervisors and MAPEH school coordinators:
 - a. Lesson guides
 - b. PowerPoint presentation
 - c. Student worksheets
- To facilitate faster distribution, they may also download the materials in Google Drive. The link will be provided by NPI through ASI.
- The use of these materials is flexible. Teachers are encouraged to adapt these materials in whatever learning delivery mode is most appropriate for them.
- ASI will create pocket Facebook Messenger Groups (called 'Teacher's Lounge') in each divisions or districts to answer queries pertaining to the program, contest mechanics and distribution of prizes.
- 8. Community engagement admins called 'Teacher's Aide' are provided by ASI to guide the teachers within these Messenger Groups.

PART 2: NESTLÉ WELLNESS CAMPUS DANCERCISE

- NPI, through ASI, will provide a soft copy of the new Nestlé Wellness Campus music and dancercise video to both division supervisors and MAPEH school coordinators.
- Teachers are encouraged to use the dancercise during online synchronous sessions.
 If synchronous sessions are not possible, learners may do the dancercise on their own with their family.
- For wider dissemination, the Nestlé Wellness Campus dancercise video will be uploaded on YouTube (via the official channel of Nestlé Philippines) and on the Nestlé Wellness Campus Facebook Group.

PART 3: NESTLÉ WELLNESS CAMPUS FACEBOOK GROUP

The Nestlé Wellness Campus program aims to get the best ideas, practices and approach to effectively educate and encourage learners and parents to practice the seven healthy habits.

This school year, NPI in partnership with DepEd, will be launching the Nestlé Wellness Campus Facebook Group (hereafter referred to as "Nestlé Wellness Campus FB Group"), a community page dedicated to teachers, the "Ka-Wellness" in promoting and advocating health, wellness, and nutrition not only to their students but also to their families. The Nestlé Wellness Campus FB Group aims to empower the 'diskarte' in teachers, inspiring them with ideas, entertaining them with Nestlé-sponsored events, Facebook Live sessions, webinars and equipping them with credible and informative materials.

The Nestlé Wellness Campus FB Group will be exclusive to public school teachers from the participating DepEd Regions. To enable this, ASI will get the basic details of the MAPEH teachers either through the MAPEH School Coordinators or the teachers themselves. The information to be collected will be limited to their name, mobile number, Facebook account name and email address. NPI, through its duly designated Facebook community manager NuWorks Interactive Labs, Inc. (the "NW") will ask the following screening questions to validate the eligibility of the joiner:

- 1. What is your full name?
- 2. What school do you belong to?
- 3. Select one, I am:
 - a. A teacher/ facilitator at this school
 - b. A staff at this school
 - c. Others

Upon answering these questions, the joiners must agree to the set of rules and regulations listed in the Facebook group, which will ensure order and foster a positive and welcoming environment.

I. Major Award: NESTLÉ WELLNESS CAMPUS OF THE YEAR

- The contest aims to get the best ideas, best practices and find better ways or approaches to effectively encourage our students and parents on the seven healthy habits.
- 2. The Nestlé Wellness Campus of Year Awards is open to the schools who belong to the regions covered by the Nestlé Wellness Campus Program.
- Each region participating in the Nestlé Wellness Campus program will pick and send their top 10 Grade School Entries and top 10 Junior High School Entries. The divisions / regions will be the ones to screen and filter their schools for final submission to NPI through their assigned Teachers' Aides (c/o ASI).
- 4. The registration form will be uploaded in the Nestlé Wellness Campus FB group through a post. Only 1 representative may submit an entry per school via email to nestlewellnesscampus@alphabetsoup.ph
- 5. Participant must have entries in all the following categories:
 - i. Pinaka-Best in Dancercise
 - ii. Pinaka-Best in School Healthtivities
 - iii. Pinaka-Best in Integrating Modules
- 6. Participating schools must have implemented these activities for the school year 2020-2021. ASI's teacher's aides will be conducting video calls and photo documentation during program implementation monitoring and validation.
- 7. Participants must submit a *portfolio* in .zip file containing the following:
 - a. Copy of accomplished registration form in PDF
 - b. Dancercise Demo video for Pinaka-Best in Dancercise

The divisions / regions will be the ones to screen and filter their schools for final submission to NPI through their assigned Teachers' Aides (c/o ASI).
- 4. The registration form will be uploaded in the Nestlé Wellness Campus FB group through a post. Only 1 representative may submit an entry per school via email to nestlewellnesscampus@alphabetsoup.ph
- 5. Participant must have entries in all the following categories:
 - i. Pinaka-Best in Dancercise
 - ii. Pinaka-Best in School Healthtivities
 - iii. Pinaka-Best in Integrating Modules
- Participating schools must have implemented these activities for the school year 2020-2021. ASI's teacher's aides will be conducting video calls and photo documentation during program implementation monitoring and validation.
- 7. Participants must submit a portfolio in .zip file containing the following:
 - a. Copy of accomplished registration form in PDF
 - b. Dancercise Demo video for Pinaka-Best in Dancercise
 - The video should be uploaded on YouTube with its privacy settings set to public. Featured students must sign and submit the waiver prior to airing.

 - iii. A YouTube Link to the video must be indicated in the registration form.

 - v. In case of technical difficulties or incorrect privacy settings, the assigned Teacher's Aide will reach out to the participating school to resend the video and/or fix its privacy settings. The participating school will only be given 24 hours after the Teacher's Aide's notification to fix the error. Failure to submit a full/ working copy of the Dancercise Demo video to the participant's Teacher's Aide will result to forfeiture or entry.

- vi. The making of the Dancercise Demo Video entries should only be done within the homes or the private properties of the participants/ the school's selected participant. Gathering in public or communal spaces for the purposes of this video is strictly discouraged.
- vii. The Dancercise Demo Video can be a compilation of dance clips edited together to make one cohesive video entry. The participants per filming location/ clip should be from the same household and should not exceed 5 people.
- viii. The demo video should only use the official Nestlé Wellness Campus Dancercise for School Year 2020-2021.
- ix. The participants will be given the freedom to create their own choreography for the Dancercise Demo Video but should only dance the official Wellness Song Choreography during the chorus of the song.
- x. Dancercise demo videos with choreography that are presented/ considered as lewd, sexually explicit, and/ or deemed inappropriate for children by the contest facilitators (NPI, NW, and/ or ASI) will automatically be disqualified.

c. Portfolio for Pinaka-Best in School Healthtivities

- The portfolio should be in .pdf format.
- ii. It should be no less than 10 slides and should not exceed the maximum 50 slides; and
- iii. Must contain the following information:
 - 1. What 3 relevant Healthivities were you able to conduct this school year to promote the practice of the seven healthy habits?
 - 2. How are you going to adapt and sustain the 3 Healthivities that your school have implemented in the new normal?
- iv. All writeups must be in English
- v. The file name of the portfolio should follow the proper naming convention: "<Region> <School Name> Pinaka-Best in School Healthtivities 2020"

d. Portfolio for Pinaka-Best in Integrating Modules

- i. The portfolio should be in .pdf format.
- ii. It should be no less than 10 slides and should not exceed the maximum 50 slides; and
- iii. Must contain the following information:
 - How did you integrate the modules in your school's learning delivery mode (i.e. SLMs, online class, etc) or in other learning areas?
 - 2. What is your school's best practice (1) in utilizing the modules?

- 3. How did the implementation of Nutrition, Health, and Wellness Initiatives in the school promote behavior change?
- iv. All writeups must be in English
- v. The file name of the portfolio should follow the proper naming convention: "<Region> <School Name> Pinaka-Best in Implementing Modules 2020"
- 8. The portfolio must be uploaded on Google Drive. The Google Drive link must be sent to nestlewellnesscampus@alphabetsoup.ph. The email heading should follow the proper naming convention: "<Region> <School Name> Nestle Wellness Campus of the Year Portfolio"
- 9. All contents of the portfolio and dancercise demo video must have been performed during the school year 2020-2021.
- Only 1 email submission is allowed per school. In cases of duplicate submissions, only the latest submission will be considered.
- 11. To win the Nestlé Wellness Campus of Year Award, the participant must have garnered the highest aggregate score (total of category scores multiplied by their respective weights). The weights will only be used in obtaining the aggregate score of each participant.

- 12. The screening of entries will be conducted by NW and ASI. During this screening process, NW and ASI will check if the schools have complied with the portfolio mandatories. Ineligible entries will be automatically eliminated from the competition. Elimination of entries is final and cannot be subject for appeal or discussion.
- 13. Once the screening process has been completed, the remaining entries will be graded according to the criteria of judging for the 3 categories of the Nestlé Wellness Campus of the Year Awards Show. The first grading process will be conducted by NW and ASI. In this grading process, the top 5 highest scoring schools per category (e.g. 5 Schools for Pinaka-Best in Dancercise Elementary, 5 Schools Pinaka-best in Dancercise High School, etc.) will be shortlisted.
- 14. The 30 shortlisted schools will then be cascaded to the Jury Heads (representatives from NPI along with representatives from the Department of Education) for the final grading process. The entries will be graded according to the criteria of judging for the 3 categories of Nestlé Wellness Campus of the Year Awards Show. To ensure contest objectivity and fair contest judging, the names, division, region or any identifiable details of the participating schools/ teachers will be hidden from the Department of

Education representatives. For more information on the criteria for judging per category, see Minor Awards.

- 15. The top 3 highest scorers per category will be announced during the Nestlé Wellness Campus Year End Awards Show. This event will be a live hosted event mounted on the Nestlé Wellness Campus FB Group through a Facebook Live Session.

II. Minor Awards:

A. Pinaka-Best in Dancercise

- The Pinaka-Best in Dancercise Award is a minor award that will constitute 30% of the
 participants' overall Nestlé Wellness Campus of the Year score. In this category, the
 participants' can flex their creativity and dance prowess by taking on the challenge of
 dancing to the complete official Wellness Song.
- This category is open to the schools who belong to the regions covered by the Nestlé Wellness Campus.
- 3. The registration form template will be uploaded in the Nestlé Wellness Campus FB group through a post. An accomplished version of this registration form (.PDF format) containing the participants' group name and the link to the Youtube Video of the official Dancercise Demo Video entry must be emailed to the school/participant's assigned Teacher's Aide.
- 4. The making of the Dancercise Demo Video entries should only be done within the homes or the private properties of the school's selected participants. Gathering in public or communal spaces for the purposes of this video is strictly discouraged.

These activities must hinge on nutrition, health, and wellness.
- This category is open to the schools who belong to the regions covered by the Nestlé
 Wellness Campus and has been selected by their corresponding regions as one of
 their official representatives.
- The registration form template will be uploaded in the Nestlé Wellness Campus FB group through a post. An accomplished version of this registration form in .PDF format must be emailed to the school/participant's assigned Teacher's Aide.

- 2. This category is open to the schools who belong to the regions covered by the Nestlé Wellness Campus and has been selected by their corresponding regions as one of their official representatives.
- The registration form template will be uploaded in the Nestlé Wellness Campus FB group through a post. An accomplished version of this registration form in .PDF format must be emailed to the school/participant's assigned Teacher's Aide. Representative must have an email address.

Portfolio Format and Organization The PowerPoint deck has adequate and high-quality visuals, has a comprehensive and straightforward writeup, and uses a clean, neat and visually appealing layout.	15%

III. Special Award: Pinaka-Best Wellness Guro of the Year

It is the goal of Nestlé Wellness Campus to recognize and honor outstanding teachers on an annual basis. The Pinaka-Best Guro of the Year Awards is one way of doing so.

- 1. Each region participating in the Nestlé Wellness Campus program will be given a chance to nominate 3 high school teachers, and 3 elementary school teachers from their region.
- 2. The nominees must submit a 15-slide portfolio (.ppt) along with an accomplished registration form (to be distributed/ posted in the Nestlé Wellness Campus FB Group) in .pdf format via email through their designated Teachers' Aide. Only 3 nominees/ entries per region per level (Elementary/ High School) will be accepted as determined by the region.
- The portfolio will serve as a case presentation for the nominee and must contain a
 writeup and supporting visual aids to be reviewed and judged by the Jury Heads (NPI
 and DepEd).
- 4. The writeups must be in English and must answer the following questions/ prompts:
 - i. How do you focus on closing the achievement gap/meeting the needs of all students with regards to nutrition, health, and wellness? Please provide an example of how you do this and evidence of the impact.
 - How do you encourage the parents to intentionally involve themselves in the learning and the school-life of your students?
 - iii. Describe how you have integrated the healthy habits in your teachings.

Portfolio Format and Organization The PowerPoint deck has adequate and high-quality visuals, has a comprehensive and straightforward writeup, and uses a clean, neat and visually appealing layout.	10%

- Participant must have a Facebook account, and must be a member of the Nestlé Wellness Campus FB Group.
- 9. Participants must have an active Philippine mobile number or email address.
- 10. Participant must be a teacher/ facilitator/ staff from any of the participating Nestlé Wellness Campus Program Schools for the School Year 2020-2021.
- 11. NPI through ASI will reach out to the winners through email, winner must provide/confirm his/her full name based on his/her Facebook account, and provide his/her active Philippine Mobile Number, Email Address, School/ Home address, landmarks near address, Authorized Recipient's Full Name.
- 12. Winner must provide/ confirm necessary information within 2 weeks after the email from the facilitators was sent. Failure to reply will result in forfeiture of the prize.
- 13. The Electronic Gift Certificate will be delivered to the winner's/ winning schools' representatives' mobile number and/or email address at most one (1) month after the Contest Period has ended.
- 14. The Plaque of Recognition will be delivered to the winner's/ winning schools' representatives' School/ Home address at most one (1) month after the Contest Period has ended.
