

DIVISION GUIDELINES ON THE SEARCH FOR 2021 BRIGADA ESKWELA BEST IMPLEMENTING SCHOOLS AND SELECTION FOR SPECIAL AWARDS

- 1. Pursuant to DepEd Memorandum No. 48, s. 2021 titled, "2021 Brigada Eskwela Implementing Guidelines", and Regional Unnumbered Memorandum dated October 13, 2021, on the 2021 Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools and Criteria this Office, through the SGOD-Social Mobilization and Networking Unit will conduct the Division Search for 2021 Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools.
- 2. This search is open to all public elementary and secondary schools that implemented Brigada Eskwela from August 3 to September 30, 2021. This activity aims to recognize schools' exemplary effort in the implementation of Brigada Eskwela and partnership engagement with various stakeholders to support the implementation of BE-LCP in ensuring that quality basic education is provided to learners despite the challenges brought by the Covid-19 pandemic.
- 3. The search shall be in two stages, to wit:
 - a. Document Evaluation The Division Selection and Evaluation Committee (DSEC) shall determine the top three (3) qualifiers in each category.
 - b. On-site Validation If needed, the Division Selection and Evaluation Committee (DSEC) shall conduct the on-site validation to the top two qualifiers per category to determine the division winners on the Search for 2021 Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools.
- 4. The search for 2021 Division Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools is categorized as follows:

Note: Integrated School (Kindergarten to Grade 12) may choose which level they intend to participate in the selection. Ex., if they choose elementary, the documents for the secondary level shall not be included in the evaluation.

- 5. Each District shall come up with their District Brigada Eskwela Evaluation Committee headed by the PSDS and has the responsibility of conducting the district level evaluation based on the enclosed guidelines. They are also invited to submit 1 entry per district, either an elementary or a secondary school, per Special Awards. The district result including the individual School Rating Form with scanned MOV's and a PowerPoint presentation file format per criterion shall be emailed to socmob.ctd@deped.gov.ph.
- 6. The hard copies of all documents of the best implementing schools (1st place) per category in each district shall also be forwarded to this Office, SGOD-Social Mobilization and Networking Unit on or before November 9, 2021, for the division level evaluation. Each criterion must be arranged in a separate folder. Only a photocopy of the documents shall be submitted. Late entries shall not be entertained.
- 7. The School Head shall issue a certification on the actual number of teachers with plantilla who are teaching in the entry school shall be counted.
- 8. Program of Works of ongoing projects should be properly documented (w/pictures before, during, and after project implementation, official receipts/invoices, purchase order, etc.).
- 9. New constructions such as handwashing facilities, comfort rooms, drainage, etc. funded by NGO's/private donors shall be counted under Resources Generated provided that it is a school-initiated project supported by valid documents and within the Brigada Eskwela period of implementation.
- 10. For school-based initiated projects relative to the new Brigada Eskwela framework with a counterpart from LGU and/or private donors, only funds from the LGU, but not SEF fund, and the private entity shall be considered under Generated Resources.

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- 11. Only projects are done from June to September 30, 2021, shall be considered provided that:
 - There is proof that the project was donated/acquired in support of the Brigada Eskwela program implementation.
 - Deed of Donations with Php 15,000.00 and above shall be properly notarized. A consolidated notarization is allowed.
 - Donations below Php 15,000.00 should be supported by an unnotarized Deed of Donation (attested by a witness with date donation was given) and/or similar Acknowledgement Receipt documents.
- 12. To qualify for the division level, there should only be one winning school per category and must obtain a score of **95% and above**.
- 13. The following is the composition of the Division Evaluation and Validation Committee:
