CONTEST RULES AND GUIDELINES

Poster Making

- 1. Pre-drawn sketches shall not be allowed.
- 2. There should be at least one contestant per school.
- 3. The contestant shall provide his/her own materials like ¼ cartolina (white), pastel or crayons. Barrowing of materials shall not be allowed.
- 4. Mixing of colours shall be allowed.
- 5. The title and description of the poster shall be written on a separate bond paper which will be furnished by the organizer. The description shall not exceed 50 words.
- 6. The contest shall last for one (1) hour.

Philippine Map Reading Skills (Elementary)

- 1. Each district shall have one (1) contestant; a Grade IV, V or VI pupil registered as a participant to the leadership training.
- 2. There shall be three (3) categories consisting of ten (10) items each. First round is EASY for identifying provincial capitals; AVERAGE round is identification of famous landmarks or scenic spots and DIFFICULT round is identification of places in the blind map.
- 3. Each contestant shall be given 15 minutes to answer the EASY round, twenty minutes for the AVERAGE round and thirty minutes for the DIFFICULT round.
- 4. Contestants shall be requested to pass their papers at the end of each round. Checked immediately and scores tallied on the board.
- 5. Scoring shall be based on:

Average	_	10 x 2	=	20
Difficult	-	10×3	=	30

6. The contestant who gets the highest point shall be the champion; second highest scorer, the Second Place winner and the third highest will be the 3rd Prize Winner.

Retro-Dance Contest (Elementary and Secondary)

- 1. A zonal selection be conducted.
- 2. There must be four to six members only.
- 3. Music to be used should be from the 60's or 70's dance hits.
- 4. The criteria for judging are:

Essay Writing

- 1. The essay shall be written in English.
- 2. Pre-written essays shall not be allowed.
- 3. The committee shall provide the bond paper where the essay be written.
- 4. The participant shall use black or blue pens only.
- 5. The essay shall not exceed 750 words. A 1-point deduction from the final score shall be imposed for every 10 words that exceed.
- 6. The contest shall last for 1 hour.

Pop Quiz (Secondary)

- 1. There shall be one (1) contestant per school.
- 2. Coaches shall submit 3 questions each for Easy, Average, Difficult and Clincher rounds. Easy and Average questions shall have four (4) options. These shall be accompanied by key to correction.
- 3. Scoring shall be:

4 There shall be only one (1) Division Champion.

Search for Ambassador and Ambassadress of Leadership

- 1. There must be at least one pair (1 boy and 1 girl) for every district / school (Secondary).
- 2. Candidates are registered participants to the training.
- 3. The search has four exposures, namely, Sports, Casual, Indigenous and Formal Wear.
- 4. There will be a question and answer portion.
- 5. The judges will select top 5 candidates for both boys and girls.
- 6. The top 5 candidates will again be given another set of questions.
- Minor awards are: Best in Sports Wear, Best in Casual Wear, Best in Formal Wear, Darling of the Crowd, Mr. and Ms. Congeniality, Mr. and Ms. Photogenic and Best in Ramp.
- 8. Major awards are 4th Runner-Up, 3rd Runner-Up, 2nd Runner-Up, 1st Runner-Up and Ambassador and Ambassadress of Leadership.

(Additional for Elementary)

- 9. Aside from the beauty (25%) brains (25%), 50% will be from popularity amount raised from garbage sales supported by receipts from junk shops where the garbage materials were sold. Without receipts, amount presented will not be honored. Canvassing will be done at the time of the Search.
- 10. There shall be no talent portion.

NOTE: In all contests, the decision of the judges is final.

VOCAL SOLO

- 1. Every zone shall have one (1) contestant male or female registered in the training.
- 2. The song shall be in English or Filipino OPM.
- 3. It should be a minus one accompaniment.
- 4. The attire should be appropriate to the song.

CRITERIA FOR JUDGING

- 1. Musicality 35% (quality, pitch, power, tone, control, phrase)
- Musicianship 30% (balance, accuracy of rhythm, direction)
- 3. Visual effect 25% (costume, posture, expression, technique)
- 4. Audience Appeal 10%
 Total 100%
