

# 11th DIVISION YOUTH FOR ENVIRONMENT SCIENCE (YES) CAMP ELEMENTARY/SECONDARY

To: Public Schools District Supervisors
Elementary/Secondary School Principals
Elementary/Secondary School Head Teachers

Pursuant to DepEd Order No. 72, s. 2013 and DepEd Memorandum No. 254, s. 2007 re: Thrusts and Activities of the Youth for Environment in Schools Organization (YES-O) particularly paragraph 3, letter f, and DepEd Order No. 39, s. 2013, the 11th Division Youth for Environment Science (YES) Camp shall be conducted at the Twin Rock Beach Resort, Igang, Virac, Catanduanes with the following dates:

**Elementary** – September 19 - 21, 2013**Secondary** – September 22 - 24, 2013

- 2. With the theme, "Reducing Our Carbon Footprints", the YES Camp (Ako ay Handa Series) emphasizes the significance of climate change mitigation and adaptation efforts and focuses on how each individual, school and community nationwide can contribute in reducing the carbon footprint. It is enclosed on Republic Act No. 9512 (Environmental Awareness and Education Act of 2008) and Republic Act No. 9729 (Climate Change Act of 2009).
- 3. The YES Camp seeks to achieve the following objectives:
  - a. learn more about Climate Change and Global Warming and the various Mitigation and Adaption efforts especially as regards reducing carbon footprint;
  - b. inculcate among pupils, students and teachers the importance and relevance of reducing the carbon footprint as a doable and practical way to mitigate and adapt to the changing world;
  - c. develop pupils' and students' deeper awareness on the state of the environment, focusing on significant issues and concerns;
  - d. encourage pupils' and students' active participation and determined concrete action in the protection, preservation and rehabilitation of the environment:
  - e. instill environment values in every pupil and student to motivate actual involvement in worthwhile programs, projects and activities for the environment and:
  - f. strengthen the implementation of the YES Program pursuant to DepEd Order No. 52, s. 2011 entitled Strengthening Environmental Education in Public and Private Schools and DepEd Order No. 93, s. 2011 entitled Mandated Programs, Projects and Activities, Various Forms, and Targets Pertinent to the Youth for Environment in Schools Program.

- 4. Activities in this Camp include plenary sessions, breakout sessions and outdoor contests such as:
  - > Theme Capturing Elementary/Secondary
  - > Environmental Quiz Elementary/Secondary
  - On-The-Spot Poster Making Elementary/Secondary
  - Cartooning Elementary
  - ➤ Environmental Spelling Elementary
  - Search for Lakan and Lakambini ng Kalikasan -Elementary/Secondary
  - Speech Choir Elementary/Secondary
  - Sayawit para sa Kalikasan Secondary
  - Cooking Low Carbon Food Secondary
- 5. The facilitators to this training are the pupils/ students and advisers who attended the YES Camp at Baguio City.
- 6. Expected to participate are the following:
  - a. Eighteen (18) YES-O Officers and 3 advisers per district Elementary
  - b. Thirty (30) officers/members per school and 2 advisers Secondary
  - c. Officers of the SCAAC Elementary/ Secondary
    - \* Parents permit must be secured before submitting the Registration Form. Participation is purely voluntary.
- 7. The advisers are requested to confirm their participation by submitting the Pre-Registration Form on or before September 16, 2013 to the following: *Elementary* **Mrs. Judy Marie Barro** (VPES), *Secondary* **Mrs. Mary Rose Sta. Rosa** (CNHS). Only those who will register on this date will be accommodated.
- 8. A registration fee of Nine Hundred Pesos (Php 900.00) shall be charged each participants (pupil/student and adviser) for food (7 meals and 4 snacks), entrance fee, awards, honorarium of speakers and other miscellaneous expenses, chargeable against School MOOE Funds, SEF and PTA Funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
- 9. Enclosure No. 1, 2 and 3 to this Memorandum bears the guidelines for the different events, working committees and Pre-Registration Form.
- 10. Wide dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

## **CONTEST GUIDELINES**

#### A. ON-THE-SPOT POSTER MAKING CONTEST

- 1. Only one (1) contestant per district plus DPSSMC and JMAMES SPED.
- 2. The poster should revolve around the theme which will be announced by the contest administrator during the contest proper.
- 3. The medium for artistry will be oil pastel only (any color). The required base paper to be used during the contest is  $\frac{1}{4}$  size white cartolina.
- 4. All materials should be brought by the participant.
- 5. Borrowing materials from other contestants shall not be allowed.
- 6. At the option of the contestants, he/she may use pencils to draft sketches of his/her ideas/concepts.
- 7. The allotted time for the contest is two hours, after which the entries shall be submitted to the contest administrator. Contestants may decide to submit his/her poster earlier without waiting for the lapse of two hours.
- 8. Each poster shall be identified by a number that corresponds to the number and identity of the contestant for the judging process.

#### B. CARTOONING

- 1. Only one (1) contestant per district plus DPSSMC and JMAMES SPED.
- 2. The cartooning should revolve around the theme which will be announced by the contest administrator.
- 3. The medium shall be sign pen and pentel pen. The required base paper to be used is  $\frac{1}{4}$  size white cartolina. Only the cartolina will be provided by the management.
- 4. At the option of the contestant, he/she may use pencils to draft sketches of his/her idea/concept.
- 5. The allotted time for the contest is two (2) hours.
- 6. Judging shall be based on the following:

Originality of idea 40%
Relevance to the theme 40%
Overall Impact 40%
TOTAL 100%

# C. SPEECH CHOIR

- 1. Only one (1) entry per district plus DPSSMC and JMAMES SPED.
- 2. A minimum of five (5) and a maximum of ten (10) students shall compose a group.
- 3. The poem to be interpreted, whether in English or Filipino, shall be chosen by the contestants and should revolve around this year's YES Camp theme.

- 4. The presentation should last for a maximum of five (5) minutes, which shall include the introduction and exit of the performers. The presentation shall be stopped when time is up.
- 5. All contestants must memorize and recite their respective piece while doing the interpretation.
- 6. Musical accompaniment, whether disc-generated or live, is not allowed.
- 7. Props and costumes should be at a minimum only and must be made from recycled materials.
- 8. Judging shall be based on the following criteria:

Environmental Message	40%
Clarity of the Delivery of the Piece	30%
Precision of Movements	20%
Projection and Overall Impact	<u>10%</u>
TOTAL	100%

# D. ENVIRONMENTAL QUIZ

- 1. All campers are encouraged to participate in the Quiz provided that they are in the venue before the start of the contest.
- 2. English and Filipino shall be used as the official languages in the conduct of the quiz.
- 3. Questions shall focus on environmental facts, laws, current events, initiatives, trivia and other subjects pertaining to the environment and ecology.
- 4. Each question shall be read twice by the quizmaster. The contestants shall only answer as soon as the quizmaster shall have read the question twice and have so indicated their time to write the answer in big bold letters. Countdown shall start immediately thereafter.
- 5. Contestants shall be given a maximum of twenty (20) seconds to answer questions that require computation. Other questions shall only be allotted ten (10) seconds.
- 6. The contestants shall bring their own pens, answer sheets shall be provided by the organizers. Should the contestants decides to change an answer, he/she shall cross out the answer so written with only one horizontal line and the new answer shall be written legibly above the crossed out answer. The contestant is allowed to change answer within the time allotted for a particular question.
- 7. The contestants shall raise their pens as soon as the allotted time to answer is over.
- 8. If applicable, depending on the number of entries, an elimination round shall be held.
- 9. During the elimination round, failure to answer seven (7) out of ten (10) questions correctly shall disqualify and eliminate the contestant. The elimination round shall involve easy, average and difficult questions.
- 10. For the elimination round, only twenty (20) or less qualifiers shall advance to the finals regardless of school/district.

## E. LAKAN AND LAKAMBINI NG KALIKASAN

- 1. Only one (1) entry for Lakan at Lakambini per district shall participate plus DPSSMC and JMAMES SPED.
- 2. The candidates must be a registered camp participants.
- 3. Talent Show shall be done before the pageant proper to be announced by the management. Talent to be presented must have relevance to environmental

awareness and must not exceed three (3) minutes. Only minimum props and costumes are allowed.

- 4. The pageant proper shall consist of the following:
  - a. Sports Wear white shorts and YES-O T-shirt
  - b. Casual Wear malong only
  - c. Kalikasan Attire

Contestants shall wear creative costumes using recycled materials. The attire should be made only during the camp. Bringing of pre-made costumes is STRICLY prohibited. It should be done inside the camp using only the materials to be provided by the management.

- **d.** Professional make-up artists will not be allowed during the pageant. The contestants make-up should be done by the advisers and coparticipants.
- 5. Question and Answer

The question to be answered will have relevance to the theme.

6. Judging during the pageant proper shall be based on the following criteria:

Beauty and Personality 40%
Intelligence and Wit 35%
Stage Presence/Overall Impact 25%
TOTAL 100%

## F. ENVIRONMENTAL SPELLING

- 1. All campers are encouraged to participate in the Spelling provided that they are in the venue before the start of the contest.
- 2. The spelling words shall focus on environmental facts, laws, current events, initiatives, trivia and other subjects pertaining to the environment and ecology.
- 3. Each word shall be read twice by the quizmaster. The contestants shall only answer as soon as the quizmaster shall have read the word twice and have so indicated their time to write the answer in big bold letters. Countdown shall start immediately thereafter.
- 4. Contestants shall be given a maximum of twenty (20) seconds to write the word.
- 5. The contestants shall bring their own pens, answer sheets shall be provided by the organizers. Should the contestants decides to change an answer, he/she shall cross out the answer so written with only one horizontal line and the new answer shall be written legibly above the crossed out answer. The contestant is allowed to change answer within the time allotted for a particular word.
- 6. The contestants shall raise their pens as soon as the allotted time to answer is over.
- 7. If applicable, depending on the number of entries, an elimination round shall be held.
- 8. During the elimination round, failure to answer seven (7) out of ten (10) questions correctly shall disqualify and eliminate the contestant. The elimination round shall involve easy, average and difficult questions.
- 9. For the elimination round, only twenty (20) or less qualifiers shall advance to the finals regardless of school/district.
